

Indigenous Australians' Health Programme Primary Health Care Funding Model

Working together for better outcomes

The Australian Government has partnered with key stakeholders including the National Aboriginal Community Controlled Health Organisation (NACCHO) and the Australian Medical Association to develop a funding model for primary health care under the Indigenous Australians' Health Programme (IAHP).

The purpose of the model is to distribute funding fairly and transparently, based on activity levels, the cost of delivering services and the relative health needs of locations.

A funding model where all services benefit

From 1 July 2020, funding for eligible ACCHS delivering primary health care under the IAHP will be calculated using the funding model.

\$90 million additional investment to further support primary health care and targeted to need. 3 year funding agreements for greater workforce continuity and planning. Annual indexation for all services. No service to lose funding - funding levels maintained in real terms. Streamlined grant application processes to reduce administrative burden.

What next?

Eligible ACCHS will soon be invited to confirm their intention to renew funding set to expire on 30 June 2020. As part of this process, service-specific information about the funding allocated through the IAHP Primary Health Care Funding Model will be provided.
